

Old Quebec and the Marche du Vieux Port de Quebec


Take the Funicular (Trolley) down to Old Quebec and explore the adorable streets, shops, and restaurants. A 10-minute walk will bring you to the Marche du Vieux-Port de Quebec (Old Port Market) where you will find wonderful artisan products like Maple Syrup.





Upper Town Quebec City


In the Upper Town, explore the shopping areas, hotels, and restaurants as well as the Terrasse Dufferin, Place Royal, Basilique Cathédrale - Notre-Dame-de-Québec, and the Musée national des beaux-arts du Québec.



Fortifications of Quebec

Start the day at the Dufferin Terrace, near the monument to Samuel de Champlain. From there, take the staircase down and cross the street into Montmorency Park where you can begin walking the fortifications.


Along the way you will be able to visit Artillery Park, Porte St-Jean & Porte Kent, Citadelle de Québec (where you can buy a ticket for a guided tour), Plains of Abraham (Battlefield Park), Governors Promenade, and Saint-Louis Forts and Châteaux National Historic Site.





Ile d'Orleans

The Island provides stunning natural views as well as fabulous vineyards. We highly recommend a visit to Vignoble Ste-Petronille , Cassis Monna & Filles, and Cidrerie Verger Bilodeau.



Montmorency Falls

After parking at the foot of the waterfall you can explore the lower area, walk up the stairs to the top of the waterfall, take a ride on the Cable Car, and zipline across the falls.
